Other rules regarding Sixth-Form appearance:

- Hair should be of a natural colour
- Jewellery should be discrete
- **Tattoos:** It is illegal for people under the age of 18 to get a tattoo. This legislation was brought in under the Tattooing of Minors Act 1969. This is the case even if the minor is accompanied by their parents. The school could report a tattooist should they tattoo a minor. This would lead to prosecution and a fine for that tattooist.
- A jacket MUST be worn at all times when moving around the school, with all styles of uniform.
