#### Success all around!

This half term can only be described as fruitful for our sports teams and dancers. It has been fantastic to see so many students representing the school, competing in District and County Finals as well as watching them perform in an annual Performing Arts Show!

#### Netball

This half term has seen the netball season draw to a close with many of our teams playing in District League and District Tournaments. Special mention must go to our Year 8A team who were crowned Watford Champions in this year's tournament, strong performances against Aldenham, RMS and a close fought victory over Haberdashers saw the girls come out on top. The Year 10 team didn't get an opportunity to contest for their title as they were busy playing in the Hertfordshire County Plate Final, which unfortunately clashed. A brilliant 32-10 victory over Rickmansworth in the semi final set up the final against Goffs, who we had lost to earlier on in the season. Despite the game being end to end, the girls ultimately fell to a 4 goal defeat. They should be very proud to have gotten this far.

#### Football

It was Final time for both our Year 7A and 10A teams after both teams qualified as a result of their league positions.

The Year 10 team had to play Rickmansworth, the only school who had beaten them in the league. Despite scoring first, a sloppy second half resulted in

Rickmansworth winning the game 2-1 and taking the title. It is the second year in a row the team has lost in the Final, despite winning the regular league.

The Year 7 team played St Michael's in their final after winning their league comfortably. The game went our way from the very beginning, with our boys winning 5-0 and being crowned District Champions.

The boys also had a nail biting game in the Herts County Semi Final against Bishop Stortford High School. A 2-2 draw at the end of normal time saw penalties taken as the decider. Some excellent penalties, alongside two saves from Dillon Tank in goal, meant the boys eventually won 7-6. They will play Richard Hale in the Final after Easter.
