### Sport

It has been absolutely fantastic to see so much sport being played over this half term. As a department, we have completed 163 competitive matches across 7 different sports.

For the boys, the main focus this term has been football where our teams are going into the final matches with all to play for.

The Years 7A, 9A and 9B, 11A and Senior teams are all in contention for a place in the District Finals, with our final games due to be played in early January. The 7B and 9B teams remain in the National Cup and are both hoping for a long run in the competition. The Year 7 team are playing Winston Churchill School from Woking and the 9B team due to face Redborne Upper School from Bedfordshire. In total, we have played 106 games of football with 48 wins, 4 draws and 54 losses. A great achievement from all students, particularly those in our B teams who are the only B team in the District League and regularly compete against other schools A teams.

The boys are looking forward to beginning their rugby and basketball seasons in January.



The girls have played a mixture of netball, hockey and football. In football, The stand out performers have been the U13s who have made it to the County Cup Semi Final. A convincing 4-0 victory over Hemel School was a great way to make the last 4. They are due to play Beaumont School in January for a place in the final.



In our netball season (which runs until Easter), the Year 9A girls have started their season in fantastic form beating RMS, Haberdashers and St Michaels. With more games to come in the new year, the team has a great chance to win the District League. The Senior Girls also performed fantastically in their District Tournament, with some great results against RMS and Aldenham, finishing in 3rd place overall.

The Year 10 girls hockey team are yet to concede a goal in their matches with a 5-0 win over St John Lawes and a 8-0 win over Aldenham. Our Year 7 and 8 girls have experienced their first hockey matches for Parmiter's and despite the results not going our way, are making great progress as teams!



Our U14 and U16 girls table tennis and badminton teams, all won the district competitions and headed to the County finals representing Three Rivers. The U14 girls' table tennis were the best performers and finished 2nd in Hertfordshire.



Overall, this half term has been an incredibly busy one, it has been fantastic to see such engagement in clubs and fixtures. We have had over 400 students represent the school with many more attending clubs and activities.

We are looking forward to the New Year and in particular the Performing Arts Show, in January.
