We thank you so much for all of your efforts so far this year and we look forward to what the new half term will bring in the world of Parmiter's Houses. It has been a busy first half term for our sports teams, with the main focus being on football, hockey and Badminton.

Our football teams have started the season with mixed results. The Year 7A team currently sit mid-table of their league with two matches to play. A fantastic performance against Verulam in the National Cup has been the highlight so far. The 7B team has struggled against other schools' A teams but, with performances improving, we know there are some wins coming shortly. The Year 8A team continues to dominate and outstanding performances against St Michaels, St Clement Danes and Queens sees them top the table. There was a disappointing defeat to Beaumont in the National Cup, losing a close game 2-1. The 8B and 9B teams continue to work hard and have been rewarded with some strong performances. The 8Bs were fantastic in the recent 2-2 draw with St Clement Danes.

The Year 9A team have started the league season strongly, with a brilliant win against St Michaels. They are playing Samuel Ryder in the County Cup after half term, where we hope they will continue their momentum. Congratulations to the captain, Hayden Stapelberg, who has been selected to play as part of the Hertfordshire Schools FA team. The Year 10A team have, unfortunately, been knocked out of both the National and County competitions but, with the league now the big focus, we are hopeful they can push on for the remainder of the season.

The Senior teams have come up against some excellent sides, losing in both the National Cup to Sandringham and Simon Balle in the County Cup. With most of the league games to come after half term, we are hoping to be pushing for the league title.

The girls' teams are flying in the National Cup, with strong wins against Cox Green and Chiswick School. Both the U13 and U15 teams are due to play Beaumont for a place in Round 3. In the league, a fine performance from the Under 15 team against RMS has been another highlight. Congratulations to Sundus Naqvi and Daisy Jackson, who have both been selected to play as part of the Hertfordshire Schools FA team this season.

A special thank you must be given to all our students who have volunteered to referee and officiate games, we couldn't do it without their support. They are all a credit to Parmiter's.



It has been brilliant to see our badminton teams get more opportunity to play competitive fixtures, particularly for the U14 and U16 Boys in the School Sports National Competition. After whitewash wins over Beaumont and Hitchin Boys, the team are through to round three where they will meet Haberdashers after half term. The Under 14s navigated Sandringham with ease but came up against a strong Haberdashers team in round 2. In the District competition, both squads were unbeaten and qualified for the County Finals in December. The U14 and U16 Girls Badminton teams had great success in the Watford District League, with both teams joining the boys in the Hertfordshire finals.

Our Year 8 hockey team were one of the stars this half term, competing

against some of the very best private schools in the County competition. Wins against RMS and Haileybury, along with a draw against Hockerill, resulted in the team finishing in 2nd place and narrowly missing out on qualification to the regional rounds.





We have entered the English Schools Cross Country Cup for the first time and it was a joy to watch our teams perform so admirably. It was the Under 13 boys team who impressed the most, winning their event with ease. Jonah McNaught, running for Parmiter's for the first time, finished in 3rd place, closely followed by Max Henson in 6th and Simeon Azeez in 8th. The team will compete in the regional finals in November.

Opportunity to support SEND provision in Watford, Three Rivers, Bushey and Radlett

DSPL 9 (<u>http://dsplarea9.org.uk/</u>) brings together parents/ carers, staff from early years settings, schools and colleges, local authority officers, and representatives from other agencies, to make sure that there is a range of services available in their local community that meets the needs of children and young people with SEND, aged 0-25, as close to home as possible.

An opportunity has come up for a new parent or carer to join DSPL9 in order to share the views of families in the area and be part of the decision-making process for the services that are put in place locally. HPCI (Herts Parent Carer Involvement (hertsparentcarers.org.uk) will provide support through training and regular meetings for parents/carers to share their experiences. If you would be interested in taking up this role (which would likely mean attending at least one meeting every half term), please contact Gemma Hall at <u>gemmahall@dsplareag.org.uk</u>
