

Stargardt's connected is a UK based charity that aims to raise awareness, give support and to seek a cure. Founded in 2019 by Bhavna Tailor after her son Ethan's diagnosis in 2015.

Stargardt's disease is an inherited eye condition that causes vision loss, often beginning in childhood or the teen years. It mainly affects central vision, making it hard to read, see details or recognise faces, while peripheral vision tends to not be as severe

Stargarddt's Connected raises awareness, offers resources, and creates connections so no one feels alone. Money raised goes towards research projects, support programs, family events and conferences.

Year 10 Art and Textiles Trip to Cornwall

The Year 10 Art and Textiles class set off on a journey to Cornwall, kicking things off with travel on Wednesday, 17th of September. After a long day, they arrived at the Blue Room Hostel in Newquay around 10 PM and rested for the day of activities ahead.

Day 2: The Eden Project

Bright and early the next day, they headed to the Eden Project. The biomes were stunning and bursting with plant life focused on sustainability.

The students split into smaller groups to dive into what the Eden Project had to offer. Inside the Rainforest Biome, the warm, humid air surrounded them, and they pulled out their sketchbooks and drew a variety of plants. With approximately 15 minutes for each task, they sketched everything from hanging vines to vibrant orchids and cocoa plants.

Next stop was the Mediterranean Biome. There, the students got to explore herbs and veggies, sketching everything from peppers to pumpkins. Each of them picked one to focus on and created detailed drawings. It was a great opportunity to improve their sketching skills on organic subjects while learning about how important these plants are for our planet.

After a morning of art and creativity, they treated themselves to some ice cream at the café. Lunch included more sketching and wandering around, taking in all the sights. They had a chance to shop for some sustainable goodies like herbal teas and beeswax wraps in the Eden Project gift shop.

Dinner that night was at a homely Italian restaurant. They enjoyed garlic bread, fresh pizza, and rich pasta, chosen in class the week before. It was the perfect way to unwind and enjoy each other's company after a busy day.

Back at the Blue Room, the students spent the evening refining their artwork and rested for the next day, which had the most packed itinerary yet.

Day 3: Explorations in St. Ives

On Day 3, they traveled to St. Ives, a coastal town known for its art scene and beautiful beaches. Their first stop was the Barbara Hepworth Museum, where her stunning sculptures and peaceful garden inspired them to sketch her unique works. Next, they visited Naomi Frears' studio. It was fascinating to see her creative process and hear her insights about making art.

Afterwards, the students regrouped in St. Ives' town center for (you guessed it) more ice cream. They headed to the beach, where the ocean provided the perfect backdrop for more sketching. The sea made it easy to experiment with various materials, from watercolors to pens, to capture the landscape in any way possible.

That night back at the hostel, they stayed up late, fully immersed in their art projects and packing for the following day's departure.

Day 4: Goodbye and Trebah Gardens

On their last day, the students checked out and headed to Trebah Gardens, a beautiful subtropical paradise. They took in all the breathtaking scenery and snapped tons of photos! The views were just incredible.

They wrapped things up at a nearby beach, enjoying more ice cream, skipping stones, and collecting seashells. A group photo captured their happy faces, and with keepsakes in hand, they boarded the coach for the journey home.

This trip to Cornwall was an incredible experience for everyone. It mixed art,



nature, and inspiration into a journey they'll never forget.
