Dear Year 11 Students and Parents/Carers

Year 11 Trial Examinations (December 2021)

We are writing to provide further details of the Year 11 trial examinations. The generic timetable for the examinations is shown at the end of this letter. Students will be issued with a personal examination timetable showing only their examinations, the location of each examination and their seat number in due course. To maintain hygiene standards, students will take the majority of their papers in the same allocated seat.

From Wednesday 1 December to Friday 3 December, the following examinations will take place: Food Preparation & Nutrition (practical), Art, and Music Listening. Any student taking these subjects will attend their examination(s) at the required times; at all other times they will be in their normal lessons.

From Monday 6 December until Friday 17 December students will be on study leave. This privilege is subject to good behaviour in the lead-up to this time and it may be withdrawn at any stage. Most students will only be expected to attend school for examinations during this period. Students who are behind with class work or NEA may be required to attend school in order to catch-up with their peers. If a student wishes to remain in school between examinations, they will be expected to attend the supervised revision sessions; students must therefore bring relevant revision materials to school. The normal school timetable resumes on Tuesday 4 January 2022.

All students will be reminded about the procedures for examinations. However, we thought it would be helpful to highlight some key points.

- When in school, all students are required to wear full school uniform. The usual rules regarding jewellery, hair and make-up apply.
- Although most examinations take place in the Sports Hall, some take place in other venues. Students must take careful note of where their examination is taking place.
- Students are expected to be **outside their examination room 15 minutes before the start of their examination**. This allows the examination to start promptly and the timetable to run to schedule.
- Students **must** ensure they bring all the required equipment for the examination. Due to hygiene considerations, students will not be able to borrow equipment. Only clear pencil cases may be taken into the examination room.
- No electronic equipment (mobile phones, MP3 players, iPods, etc) may be taken into any examination room.





Students are not allowed to bring wireless earphones on site. No form of headphone or earphones are to
be brought into an examination room. In order for our invigilation team to verify this, we ask that long
hair is tucked behind the ears or tied back.

• No watches may be brought into an examination room. This is now a standard procedure for public

examinations and so we will be replicating this for school examinations.

 Depending on the location of their examination, students may be asked to leave their bags outside the room. As on any school day, students are advised not to bring valuable items into school. Where they do,

students need to be aware that they will need to leave these in their bags during an examination.

If for any reason a student is absolutely unable to attend an examination, or will be unavoidably late for

an examination, please contact the school immediately (01923 671424).

It is vital that students carefully read the examination timetable, highlighting all the examinations that are

relevant to them. When students receive their personalised timetable, they must keep this safe.

Some students will have an examination 'clash'; this means that they have two examinations scheduled for the same time. Examination clashes also occur in the actual GCSE examinations. To resolve this 'clash', in most cases, one of the examinations will be scheduled for either earlier or later on the same day. For the time period between examinations, the student will be supervised by an examination invigilator so that they cannot interact with any other students who have already taken, or are about to take, the examination. Students may

revise for their next examination whilst they are being supervised.

Any student who has access arrangements for examinations will receive a student notification form; these will be distributed by Form Tutors after half-term. If you believe your child should have access arrangements but they do not receive a notification form, please contact Mrs van Rooij, SENCO, by **Wednesday 10 November**, via e-mail (j.vanrooij@parmiters.herts.sch.uk). Any query/information received after this date is unlikely to

result in any changes to arrangements for the Year 11 trial examinations.

We trust that all students will prepare well for these important examinations. Should students be required to self-isolate over this examination period, arrangements may be made for students to sit the tests upon their return to school. These arrangements will be made in consultation with the relevant Heads of Department, as there is a necessity to balance the importance of sitting the examinations with students missing lesson time in January. If the contingency arrangements of teacher assessment are used for the grading of GCSEs in Summer 2022, the outcomes of these trial examinations may be used in the grading process. However, please be

assured that no one piece of work will determine a student's final grade.

These examinations have been scheduled before Christmas in order to give students a proper break over the holiday period and to give more time for them afterwards to act upon feedback. We will share the results with

you in late January/early February. We wish all students every success.
