The majority of Year 10 students took part in a week's **Work Experience** placement in May and experienced a wide variety of different job sectors, including teaching, banking, charity work, retail, law, engineering, accountancy, veterinary, dentistry, architecture, theatre. It was an insightful week for all the students who took part and the feedback from employers was outstanding,
