Industrial Cadets



A team of six students from Year 12 took part in the **Industrial Cadets Gold Award**, in partnership with Taylor Woodrow, who provided a team mentor. We were given the task of implementing different forms of sustainable energy generation into a current setting to improve the building's energy efficiency, considering costs, design and the environment. We worked together as a team by allocating different roles according to individual strengths and interests and decided to implement heat pumps, solar cells, a vast array of green measures, phase changing materials and wind turbines to the planned new science block. The final product was a 3D model showing each of the different measures, as well as 2D plans made using the actual science block designs, and a report detailing the research and conclusions made throughout the six months. Ultimately, we successfully completed the project and won an award for our innovative design. **Shannon Heffernan**

Industrial Cadets Bronze Project Winners

Some of my friends and I participated in the Industrial Cadets Bronze Project STEM competition with Ms Hooper. We took part against other schools and we chose to do an eco-friendly sports centre, as this is what interested us as a group. We had to do a lot of research on different eco-friendly materials and we had to create a Google Form for our families to fill in, a report about our sports centre, a model of our centre and a presentation which included a video and a PowerPoint. Once we had



completed the project, we submitted it and then we had an interview with some of the examiners. At the end of the project, we attended a virtual awards ceremony and were given our award; we won the Determination Award as we lost one of our participants and still managed to carry on with the project and we came runners up for the Best STEM Solution Award. Throughout this project we developed many new skills, some of which were time management, working individually and as a team, basic accounting, computer skills and many more. Each team was allocated a different set of mentors and we were allocated our two mentors from a leading aerospace company called Leonardo and we learned about their roles and



jobs in their company. We really enjoyed this project as it was a new experience and something different that we had never done before. We would also like to give Ms Hooper a special thank you for giving us this opportunity and to helping us develop our understanding for future careers.
