The 'Three Peaks Challenge' is to walk the highest peaks in Scotland, England and Wales: Ben Nevis, Scafell Pike and Snowdon respectively. Parmiter's Parents Association is planning to take on this challenge over the weekend of Friday 26th June to Sunday 28th June 2020 by organising teams of parents, students, staff and friends of Parmiter's School to take part.

There will be a mixture of formats to cater for the inevitable mix in abilities: Some may aim to complete the challenge in the traditional 24 hours, other groups will take one, two or three days to complete just one, two or all three of the peaks. The formats will be organised to enable all groups to spend the evening of Sunday 28th at the foot of Snowdon in Betws-y-Coed where there will be a celebration for all who are taking part in the Parmiter's challenge.

A key objective of this challenge is to raise money: Firstly, to provide very important funds for the New Science Block project that will benefit all Parmiter's students and, secondly, to give support to the Teenage Cancer Trust.
