


All of the Teaching Assistants are based in Curriculum Support. During lesson times they will be supporting students in class or working with a student in Curriculum Support.

Teaching Assistants

You might see Teaching Assistants in some lessons, they are there to support everybody in the class. You can ask Teaching Assistants questions about your work or about anything you are worried about or want some help with. Teaching Assistants work closely with the Teachers and can explain things to you if you're not sure about something and will be able to guide you with your work.

Where do we go at break and lunch times?

There are two dining halls, which we call the Old Dining Hall and the New Dining Hall, and there are different queues for the canteen. You will be told where you need to queue depending on what you want to eat. The queues can be quite long but they are supervised by members of staff so, if you have any problems, there will be somebody there to help you. If you have a packed lunch, you can eat this in the New Dining Hall or under the Covered Area outside. Once you have had your lunch, you can go to a club or the Year 7 playground until period 5 starts at 2.20pm.

Different year groups use different playgrounds – your Form Tutor will show you where Year 7 students can go. There are always members of staff supervising the playgrounds, so there will always be help if you need it.

How and where do we buy food?

On your first day, your form tutor will take you to do your 'thumbprint' for **Wisepay**. This is how you will pay for your food from the canteen – you will not be using cash. Your parent/carer can top up your Wisepay account online or you can top up your account at school using the top up machines in the canteen and outside the Finance Office. There is a daily limit, so you will need to be careful how much you spend on food during the day.





The School Day at Parmiter's

This is what happens on a normal school day:

Time	What happens?	
8.35am - 8.55am	Registration in form rooms with form group. You will either stay in your form room until 8.55am or you will go to assembly.	
8.55am - 9.55am	Period 1	
9.55am - 10.55am	Period 2	
10.55am – 11.20am	Break Time: A bell will ring at the end of period 2 and your teacher will let you go to break. You can meet your friends and buy a snack from the canteen. You will be outside for break time, there is a covered area so you can still go outside if it's raining – unless it's raining very hard, in which case students are allowed to stay inside.	
11.20am - 12.20pm	Period 3	
12.20pm - 1.20pm	Period 4	
1.20pm – 2.20pm	Lunch Time is from 1.20pm to 2.20pm. A bell will ring at the end of period 4 and your teacher will let you go to lunch. As with break time, you can meet your friends, buy lunch from the canteen or eat your packed lunch. You may have a club to go to. During the first two weeks of school, you will have the opportunity to attend lunch a little bit earlier. This will give you the chance to get the hang of things	
	without all the other year groups.

Timetable and Homework

You will be given your timetable (and your homework timetable) by your form tutor, which will show you when and where your lessons are and which teachers you will have.



Chromebook



Most students will have a Chromebook. This will be used in a lot of lessons and for homework. All students with a Chromebook are expected to charge it each night before school, so that it has enough power for a whole day at school. You should not bring your charger to school.

Parmiter's School Uniform

Option A

- Plain black socks (no trainer socks).
- Plain style black shoes (not canvas or trainer style), flat ankle boots may be permitted with prior permission from SLT.

Option B









- Black tights (plain).
- Plain black socks (no trainer socks), socks must be worn over tights. Leggings with socks not permitted.
- Plain style black shoes, low heeled (51mm max), not platform soles or sling backs, trainer style or canvas. No dolly shoes, as this do not provide sufficient covering in Science and D&T lessons.
- Flat ankle boots may be permitted with prior permission from SLT.

Option C





- Plain black socks
- Plain style black shoes (not canvas or trainer style), flat ankle boots may be permitted with prior permission from SLT

 Make-up, nail varnish, acrylic/gel/shellac/nail extensions of any kind are not permitted. False eyelashes, fake tan and tattoos are forbidden. No jewellery allowed except for one gold or silver stud in each ear. No other piercings allowed. Badges, except for those connected with school, may not be worn. 		
Other	 In winter, boots may be worn to and from school. Shoes are to be worn during the school day. During excessively cold weather students will be allowed to wear boots, but only when specified by the Deputy Headteacher. 	

Lockers



Year 7 students have their own locker area, which is located off the new dining hall. Lockers must be applied for in advance – parents/carers will have received information on this.

Lost Property



If you lose something at school, check that it hasn't been handed in to Reception. If it isn't there it may have been taken to Lost Property, which is located in the PSB (Pastoral Support Base) where Mrs Doran will try to help you. For PE kit, you could also try the PE Department Lost Property.

The School Buses



You will know which number bus you will be travelling on to and from school. The buses arrive at school in time for registration in the morning, unless there has been a delay due to traffic. On these occasions you must not worry about being late, your teachers will be told that there has been a delay. At the end of the school day, you will get the bus from the Sports Hall Playground. In the morning and afternoons, there will be members of staff on the Playground to help you if you have any problems.
