SOCS Co-curricular Programme - Autumn Term 2026

We write to advise that the co-curricular programme for the Autumn term is now live on SOCS. We encourage all students and parents/carers to log in to view the wide range of clubs, activities and opportunities available. The official start date for all clubs will be **Monday 14 September**.

SOCS is our online platform designed to promote, track and monitor our co-curricular provision. It provides a central hub where students, parents and carers can see all opportunities beyond the classroom, including clubs, societies, sporting fixtures, rehearsals, performances and co-curricular activities.

Accessing SOCS

Students have already been given access to SOCS and have been shown how to use the platform. They should have synced their SOCS account to their school Google Calendar, so that all co-curricular commitments appear directly in their timetable, helping them (and you) to stay organised and committed to the activities they wish to attend.

Parents and carers can access SOCS by visiting the link on the school website, or using the direct link [here](#). Please ensure you log in using the email address registered with the school, as this is required for access. More information about how to log in can be found [here](#). Once logged in, you will be able to view the full co-curricular programme and see your child's activities and commitments. You may also choose to sync your child's activities to your own Google Calendar, which will update automatically. Your child's club will only show once they have attended a session and been added to a register. Information on how to sync activities to your calendar can be found [here](#).
